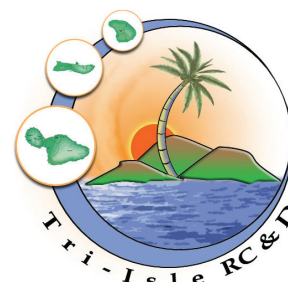

RULES & REGULATIONS

NO PARKING IN TOWN OR STAGING AREAS!

PARADE RULES:

Our community has enjoyed the Makawao 4th of July Parade for years because it celebrates democracy, freedom and our veterans! It is important for us to maintain its community-based flavor without getting too commercialized. We certainly appreciate all our sponsors and entrants for their time, commitment and dedication in preparing for the parade. However, there are certain important rules that must be followed for the safety of our participants and spectators. Please understand that these rules have come after years of experience.

1. The Parade Committee shall have the final determination in who may participate in the parade. Entries that are not appropriate for children's viewing or who promote controversial and/or negative advocacies and/or are deemed objectionable will not be allowed to participate in the parade.
2. Each unit is required to display a minimum of one American flag. More is preferable.
3. Parade entries and individual participants shall conduct themselves in an appropriate manner at all times.
4. Entrants are discouraged from passing out leaflets and/or flyers as they end up trashing the neighborhood.
5. Participants are not allowed to throw items into the crowds due to the risk of the smaller kids getting trampled. Instead, we ask you designate people walking in your unit to hand out items.
6. If you have animals participating in the parade remember to bring them water and protect them from overheating. The asphalt gets very hot so dog booties are strongly recommended. Please clean up after them.
7. All entrants are urged to provide some type of creative entertainment for children. This adds to the enjoyment for all.
8. All entrants must follow the instructions of the street marshals to avoid unnecessary delays and proper spacing of the parade. No substitutions in line-ups are allowed.
9. Entrants shall make every endeavor to maintain close spacing with the unit ahead. Activities that require a unit to stop and perform along the parade route are discouraged from doing so.
10. For the safety of all a height limitation of 14' and width limitation of 11' will be enforced on all floats and vehicles entered in the parade.
11. CROWD CONTROL: Community volunteers will be assisting with the parade security and safety. Marshals will be visible in event shirts and are available to advise them of any parade problems.
12. Vehicles breaking down in the parade will be moved to the side of the road to allow the parade to continue.
13. AWARDS: Parade results will be printed in the Maui News and announced at the Rodeo.
14. PARKING: Parking for parade entries is available at Eddie Tam and Kalama School, Lower Field. Additional parking available at Oskie Rice Arena and a free shuttle courtesy of **Valley Isle Motors** for spectators.
15. Do not throw candy or any hard objects in crowd.

MAKAWAO PARADE WAIVER

I, THE UNDERSIGNED, INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS, AGREE TO RELEASE, WAIVE AND DISCHARGE MAKAWAO PARADE FOR ALL PERSONAL INJURIES KNOWN OR UNKNOWN OR DEATH OR INJURIES TO REAL OR PERSONAL PROPERTY, CAUSED BY OR ARISING OUT OF MY VOLUNTARY PARTICIPATION IN THIS EVENT, OR SOMEHOW RELATED THERETO, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ANY DAMAGE OR INJURIES CAUSED BY HORSES, OTHER ANIMALS, SPECTATORS OR PARTICIPANTS.

I, THE UNDERSIGNED, UNDERSTAND THAT HAWAII LAW (ACT 249, 1994 HAWAII LEGISLATIVE SESSION, EFFECTIVE JUNE 29, 1994) LIMITS THE CIVIL LIABILITY OF PERSONS SPONSORING EQUINE (HORSES, PONY, MULE, DONKEY OR HINNEY) ACTIVITIES. I UNDERSTAND THAT THERE ARE INHERENT RISKS OF INJURY, INCLUDING DEATH, WHEN PARTICIPATING IN AN EQUINE ACTIVITY, WHICH RISKS INCLUDE BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO (1) THE PROPENSITY OF AN EQUINE TO BEHAVE IN WAYS THAT MAY RESULT IN INJURY OR DEATH TO PERSONS ON OR AROUND THEM, (2) THE UNPREDICTABILITY OF AN EQUINE'S REACTIONS TO SUCH THINGS AS SOUNDS, SUDDEN MOVEMENT, AND UNFAMILIAR OBJECTS, PERSONS, OR OTHER ANIMALS, (3) HAZARDS SUCH AS SURFACE AND SUB-SURFACE CONDITIONS, (4) COLLISIONS WITH OTHER EQUINES OR OBJECTS, AND (5) THE POTENTIAL NEGLIGENCE OF ANOTHER PARTICIPANT, SUCH AS FAILING TO MAINTAIN CONTROL OVER THE EQUINE, OR NOT ACTING WITHIN THE PARTICIPANTS' ABILITY.

I ALSO UNDERSTAND THAT UNDER HAWAII LAW (HAWAII REVISED STATUTES, CHAPTER 663-B) I AM PRESUMED TO HAVE ASSUMED THE INHERENT RISKS RELATED TO EQUINE ACTIVITIES. I KNOW AND UNDERSTAND THE RISK OF PARTICIPATING IN SUCH EQUINE ACTIVITIES, WHICH INCLUDE INJURY AND DEATH TO MY PERSON AND DAMAGE TO MY PERSONAL PROPERTY, AND I EXPRESSLY CHOOSE TO ASSUME THESE RISKS.
